

Academic Year 2025 Graduate School of Social Sciences, Hitotsubashi University Requirements for Application to the Doctoral Program

This document provides information for external candidates. Internal candidates i.e. those currently on a master's program at Hitotsubashi University or who already hold a master's degree from Hitotsubashi University, should see the 進学要項 (in Japanese only).

The Graduate School of Social Sciences aims to produce researchers with both broad and specialized knowledge, and professionals with a high level of expertise. The Graduate School comprises two institutes; candidates are affiliated to one of them depending on the major offered by the desired advisor the candidate specifies in their application. The Institute for the Study of Social Sciences seeks to equip its students with the desire and creativity to pursue academic knowledge in individual fields and apply that knowledge to more general areas. The Institute for the Study of Global Issues seeks to develop its students' capacity to tackle global issues in an interdisciplinary and creative manner, with an orientation toward practical solutions.

The doctoral program aims to foster independently capable researchers with advanced expertise, a wealth of learning, and outstanding research skills. Applications are welcome from those who, upon completion of the doctoral program, seek either to be active in a university or other research or educational institute, or to make use of their research skills as a leading professional in their field.

1. Number to be admitted:

Institute for the Study of Social Sciences: 30. This number includes both internal and external candidates.
Institute for the Study of Global Issues: 5. This number includes both internal and external candidates.

2. Eligibility to apply

Applicants to the program must satisfy one of the following criteria:

- (1) Have completed a master's program in the graduate school of another university or expect to complete it by March 2025.
- (2) Have completed the program of a professional graduate school or expect to complete it by March 2025.
- (3) Have a master's degree or professional degree or equivalent from a country outside Japan or expect to be awarded such a degree by March 2025.
- (4) Have a master's degree or professional degree or equivalent by taking subjects in Japan in a correspondence course of a school outside Japan, or expect to be awarded such a degree by March 2025.
- (5) Have a master's degree or professional degree or equivalent by completing a program, designated separately by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, at an educational facility in Japan offering programs of a graduate school of another country accredited by that country's educational system.
- (6) Have a master's degree or equivalent by completing a program at the United Nations University, established based on a resolution of the United Nations General Assembly of December 11, 1972 and pursuant to Article 1 Paragraph 2 of the Act on Special Measures Incidental to Enforcement of the Agreement between the United Nations and Japan Regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations University (Act No. 72 of 1976).
- (7) Be at least 24 years old by April 1, 2025 and be recognized by this Graduate School through an individual qualification review as having academic ability at least equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree.
- (8) Have graduated from university, and have engaged in research at a university or a research institute, etc. for not less than two years, and be recognized by this Graduate School based on their achievement as having academic ability at least equivalent to a master's degree.
- (9) Have engaged in research at a university or a research institution for not less than two years after completing 16 years of school education outside Japan, or after completing 16 years of school education by taking subjects in Japan in a correspondence course of a school outside Japan, and be recognized by this Graduate School based on their achievement as having academic ability at least equivalent to a master's degree.

Note 1: Persons applying under criteria (3) (8) (9) must inquire in advance by email to the Administration Office of the Graduate School of Social Sciences regarding their eligibility, no later than November 22, 2024.

Note 2: Persons applying under criterion (7) will undergo an individual qualification review prior to the application period. Please inquire to the Administration Office of the Graduate School of Social Sciences by email. Documents necessary for the individual qualification review should be submitted between November 11, 2024 and November 22, 2024. The results of the review are expected to be sent by around December 13, 2023.

3. Application period

Application period for online form completion and document submission:

December 26, 2024 (Thursday) to January 9, 2025 (Thursday)

Application documents will be accepted no later than 17:00 JST on Thursday, January 9, 2025.

4. Application procedures

The application process has two parts: online registration and submission of documents by post. You need to do both parts in order to apply for the program.

- (1) Registration of your application on the Graduate School Online Application page

Information to be entered online

Please refer to "Graduate School Application Process" posted on the web application page and proceed with the registration according to the instructions on the page.

You do not have to fill in the "Qualifications" field of the online form.

In the "Research topic" field of the online form, enter the same information as the title of your research project of "Research Plan" in **5. Application and examination fees**.

In the "Matters requiring special mention 1" field of the web application form, enter the name of the desired academic supervisor you specified in the "Research Plan". ("Undecided" is not possible.)

In the "Matters requiring special mention 2" field of the online form, enter the name of the major you specified in the "Research Plan" (either "Social Sciences" or "Global Issues").

In the "Matters requiring special mention 3" field of the online form, enter the field of study you specified in the "Research Plan" (one of "Sociological Studies", "Studies for Well-being and Inclusive Society", "Studies in History and Culture", and "Cross-Boundary Studies").

You must upload a photo of yourself on the online form, but you do not need to upload your application documents online. Please submit your application documents by post.

- (2) Postage of the application documents

Persons wishing to apply from outside Japan should follow the procedures given in the attachment "Applying from Outside Japan" rather than those given in this section.

Enclose the full set of application documents in an envelope marked in red on the lower left with **APPLICATION DOCUMENTS** and send **by registered mail** to the following address.

5. Application and examination fees

Documents and materials	Remarks
Application for Admission Form	Four printouts of the Application for Admission Form that can be downloaded from the Individual Candidate Page after registering the application on the Graduate School Online Application page. Please staple each copy individually.
Master's thesis, etc.	Three copies of thesis. Applicants who have earned or expect to earn a master's degree or equivalent without submitting a master's thesis should provide three copies of a research paper in place of the thesis. Note that in case of a significant divergence between the contents of the thesis or other research paper submitted and the research theme to be studied in the doctoral program, the submission of a supplementary paper besides the thesis, written in Japanese or English, is permitted. Provide three copies of this paper as well.

Abstract of master's thesis, etc.	Four copies of an abstract, in Japanese (around 4,000 characters) or in English (around 1,600 words), of the master's thesis or research paper submitted in place of a master's thesis. If a supplementary paper is submitted, provide four copies of an abstract of this paper as well (4,000 characters if in Japanese or 1,600 words if in English). Use A4 paper and include a cover sheet labelled "Abstract" followed by the title of the paper and your name. Please staple each copy individually.
Research Plan	Four copies. Prepare in Japanese (2000 characters maximum), or in English (800 words maximum). One copy should be prepared using the prescribed paper as a cover sheet; the other three should be duplicates of this, including the cover sheet. On the cover sheet, include the name of the faculty member desired as your advisor after acceptance into the program. Please staple each copy individually.
Master's program certificate of completion/prospective completion	One copy. This must be provided by the head of your university or graduate school dean. Persons from foreign school (persons applying under criteria (3) or (4) of 2. Eligibility for application) should also provide one copy of a certificate indicating the earned degree (M.A., M.S., etc.). The master's program certificate of completion/prospective completion itself is sufficient, however, if it includes indication of the degree (M.A. or M.S.) obtained or to be obtained.
Transcript	One copy. This must be provided by the head of your university or graduate school dean.
Copy of Residence Card, etc.	Foreign national applicants only. Submit one copy of your Residence Card (or Alien Registration Card) indicating the status and period of residence. If you have not yet been issued a Residence Card (or Alien Registration Card), please submit a copy of your passport.

Note 1: Graduates or prospective graduates from two or more graduate schools should submit a certificate of completion/prospective completion and transcripts from each of the graduate schools.

Note 2: Attach a Japanese translation of all submitted documents written in a language other than English or Japanese.

Note 3: If only a copy of a foreign-issued certificate can be submitted, have it certified by an embassy or other public agency as a copy of the original document, and submit this certificate. Be aware that the People's Republic of China embassy and consulates in Japan do not issue documents certifying the authenticity of copies of diplomas or transcripts issued in China, or certifying the authenticity of translations of the original. Notarization or authentication of diplomas and transcripts issued in China must be performed in China, either at the China Higher-education Student Information (CHSI) in Beijing, or at notarization offices in other parts of China (those recognized by the judicial agency in each region). The CHSI also accepts applications from outside China by mail for certification procedures. Applicants requiring a certificate of (prospective) graduation or (prospective) completion from an educational institution in China are urged to begin the procedures at an early date.

Note 4: On application documents to be filled out by the applicant, type or use a black ballpoint pen.

Note 5: Application and examination fees cannot be returned. Also, be sure to submit the originals of all certificates. Copies will not be accepted, other than in the cases indicated under **5. Application and**

examination fees.

Note6: If you submit a fraudulent application your acceptance will be cancelled even if you pass the admission examination

6. Selection process and criteria

The examination has two stages. At the first stage we assess the applicant's research level, the academic importance of the research project, the compatibility with the fields of this Graduate School, and the feasibility of the research plan, based on the submitted thesis and application documents. We also consider whether the School has a faculty member able to provide guidance in the area of the research project.

Those who pass the first stage go on to the second stage, an interview. The interview assesses the applicant's understanding of, ability to explain, and capacity to carry out the research described in the application. The interview is also used to assess whether the applicant has the foreign or Japanese language ability necessary for the research. Depending on the nature of the research project, the language ability assessment may be done orally or using written materials. If, however, conducting a language competency test is considered inappropriate to the nature of the research project, a comprehension test may be conducted instead, based on Japanese historical materials. Final acceptance is decided as the sum result of the first and second stages.

***Be sure to arrive at the examination room at least 10 minutes before your interview. Be sure to have your Examination Admission Card with you. Your Examination Admission Card will be available for printing from your Individual Candidate Page approximately one week after the application period ends.**

*Misconduct or not following examiners' instructions will result in disqualification.

*On the day of the examination, there may be persons near the main gate of the university offering to notify you of the results. The university has nothing to do with these people. Results are announced on graduate school's website.

8. Enrolment procedures

(1) Admission fee payment period

February 27 to March 5, 2025

Failure to pay during this period will be treated as forfeiture of acceptance to the school. Once we have received the enrollment fee, we will not return it for any reason including withdrawal from enrollment.

(2) Admission fee: 282,000 yen

Note: The University has assistance programs enabling the admission fee to be waived or deferred. Those desiring to apply for such assistance should not deposit the fee but should instead obtain the application forms from the Student Services Division (Gakusei Shien-ka) and apply within the required time period. (Application for waiver or deferral cannot be made after depositing payment. Note also that since applications are denied in some cases, sufficient readiness for payment should be made in advance.)

(3) Other

Other Procedures matters concerning enrolment will be notified separately by mail to those who are admitted. Tuition (535,800 yen annually) will be paid after enrolment. The timing and procedure of payment will be notified separately.

Entrance and tuition fees are subject to change.

9. Matters to note

Change of the admission schedule and the method

We may have to change the admission schedule and process in response to unexpected events and circumstances. Please check our website regularly for schedule updates.

Inquiries

- (1) All matters concerning entrance examinations are administered by the Administration Office of the Graduate School of Social Sciences.
- (2) If you have questions concerning entrance examinations, send your inquiry in writing, indicating your name and address, by email. Inquiries by telephone will not be accepted.

Choice of institute and research unit

- (1) You cannot switch your desired major after application.
- (2) Choose one supervisor you wish to be instructed by after admission, and indicate the major / field of the chosen supervisor on the web application form and on the research plan. (See the list of seminar instructors below.) As a general rule, the faculty member you specify in your application will become your main supervisor after admission, so it is important to choose carefully when you apply.

For those with disabilities or special needs concerning the entrance examination and special assistance for academic learning

Applicants with disabilities or special needs who require accommodation in the application process and / or once they start their program at Graduate School of Social Sciences should notify the Admissions Office by November 22, 2024 prior to submitting their application documents.

Although the Admissions Office will accept accommodation requests after this date, we may not be able to make necessary arrangements in time for the examination and / or the program starting date.

Requesting accommodation for the application process does not obligate you to apply to our program. If you are undecided about whether to apply for, you can still submit accommodation requests.

Note: Depending on the types of accommodation you request, it may take some time for us to respond.

Note on student dormitories provided by the University

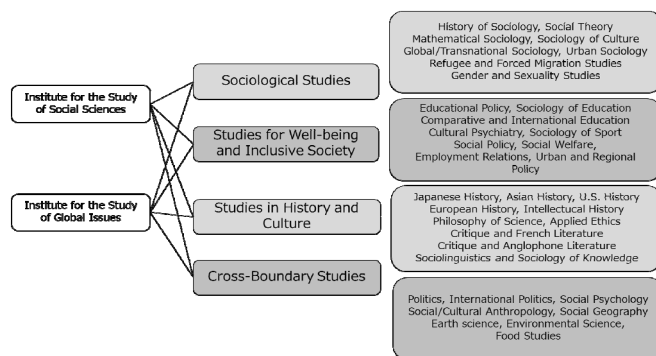
